

- Scoped Review of Glen Williams Secondary Plan 2019


Glen Williams Workplan June 2017

- Harm character and appearance of hamlet




Zoning







Interim Control By-law


- Concern raised by GWCA
- Large home rebuilds during Study
- Similar to the ICBL for Acton & Georgetown





Interim Control By-law

- Apply to older neighbourhoods in centre of Hamlet
- Prohibits for 1 year:
 - New detached houses with increased GFA 25% or more
 - Additions to houses that increase GFA by 25% or more



Does <u>not</u> apply to people who have a complete Building Permit or Minor Variance application by November 27, 2017



Interim Control By-law Exception Process

- Allow new residential development, on a case by case basis
- Owners submit details of their proposed building project
- Abutting property owners consulted (10 days to respond)
- Reviewed by Staff
 - Physical character of neighbourhood
 - Streetscape character
- Recommendations brought to Council
- 60 day appeal period
