


MILL STREET CORRIDOR PRECINCT NEIGHBOURHOOD STUDY

Your participation and input are critical in identifying key public realm improvements to the area. The following are key consultation and engagement opportunities to get involved:

1. Walk About September 19, 2018

A facilitated walk of the precinct in the company of local residents and interest groups has been planned for Wednesday the 19th of September. During this walk about you will have an opportunity to share your perspective on the neighbourhood with Town sta and the consultant team.

2. Visioning Workshop November 2018

The Visioning Workshop will provide the opportunity to introduce you to the consultant team, inform you about the study process, present information collected to date, and gather your input on the local street network issues and opportunities.

3. Ideas Workshop March 2019

The Ideas Workshop and online forum will focus on gathering your input on the consultants preliminary streetscape design solutions.

Based on your input, a set of fnal streetscape improvement options will be developed for review and approval by Town sta and Town Council.






