



INFLATABLE AMUSEMENT DEVICES TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Terms and Conditions:

1. Supervision is needed to make sure that all users are playing safely and obeying the rules of the inflatable. Supervisors should be 18 or older and have proper training. They should know the rules of the device, as well as, the occupancy limit and be able to confidently enforce both. They should also have basic first aid training in the event of an emergency.
2. Put a procedure in place for emergencies such as injuries or device deflation so the supervisors are able to deal with any situation that may arise. The number of supervisors needed may be based on device height, type and number of people, so be sure to know the specifics for your area.
3. Lay out ground rules for people to follow when using the inflatable device so everyone stays safe.
4. The organizer must provide proof that the devices have been inspected and approved by the TSSA.
5. Inflatable Device provider must provide to Town of Halton Hills a Commercial Liability Insurance Certificate in the amount of \$5 million dollars naming the Town of Halton Hills as additional insured. If the permit holder is not providing the inflatable device but hire a third party provider/vendor to have an inflatable device, that third party provider/vendor must ensure that not only the Town of Halton Hills be listed as additional insured but that the event organization is also listed as additional insured.
6. The Inflatable Device location must be approved prior by the Facility Supervisor or Parks Supervisor.

The Permit Holder shall defend, indemnify and save harmless the Corporation of the Town of Halton Hills, its elected officials, officers, employees and agents from and against any and all claims of any nature, actions, causes of action, losses, expenses, fines, costs (including legal costs), interest and damages of every nature and kind whatsoever, including but not limited to bodily injury, sickness, disease or death or to damage to or destruction of tangible property, including any loss of revenue or incurred expense resulting from disruption of service, arising out of or allegedly attributable to the negligence, acts, errors, omissions, misfeasance, nonfeasance, fraud or wilful misconduct of the Permit Holder, its directors, officers, employees, agents, contractors and subcontractors, or any of them, in connection with or in any way related to the function or activity covered by this Permit Further, in the event that the Permit Holder is not itself providing features such as firework displays, inflatable apparatuses, high risk sport activities, amusement rides, or events with livestock, but has hired a third party provider/vendor to provide such features, the Permit Holder shall obtain from that third party provider/vendor a comparable indemnity in favour of the Corporation of the Town of Halton Hills and the Permit Holder. Each such indemnity shall be in addition to and not in lieu of any insurance to be provided by the Permit Holder and (where applicable) the third party provider/vendor in accordance with the Permit, and shall survive the term of use of the Permit.

Tips for Renting an Inflatable

1. Do your research before renting any inflatable device. Does the company have a good reputation? Have they been involved in any claims? If so, were they accidental or preventable?
2. Choose a company that sets up the device rather than one where you set it up yourself. Trained professionals should always be responsible for assembly for the sake of safety.
3. The company should also provide an operator where mandatory. Operators are mandatory for devices that exceed certain heights. If an operator is not provided, the company should give you enough instruction to do it safely, including how to properly deal with emergency situations.
4. Carefully inspect the device before set up. Look for tears, rips or holes to make sure that it is safe for use.
5. The company also needs to have adequate liability insurance that names your entity as an additional insured. Obtain a copy of their policy.

Set-Up and Supervision

1. Set the device on firm, level ground with at least a foot of clearance around the perimeter.
2. Never inflate near electrical lines.
3. The opening of the device should be clear and free of debris and face a wide open area.
4. Landing mats should be placed around the edges to protect anyone who may fall out.
5. Never place the device near water.
6. The device should be securely anchored to the ground using approved stakes or ropes only. Never anchor a device to a mobile structure such as a car.
7. Any stakes used in the ground should be properly covered or marked to prevent people from tripping.
8. Always plug the blower motor into an appropriate receptacle and have a back-up generator to prevent the device from deflating during use.
9. Always follow manufacturer recommendations for set up.
10. Follow TSSA requirements.
